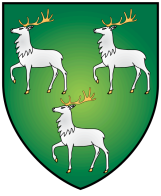

**Seconded:** bryan

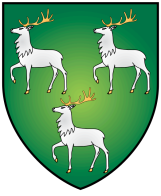
- Chris S - Hasn't been fixed for six months.

- Eddie S - Have we been charged for 6 months from Sky.
  - Alex P - yes.
- Ryan LG - Modern or old box?
  - Alex P - Sky have changed everything they can.
    - Leo G - If what we are doing doesn't work, then we'll put sky box behind the television. Could look into doing that.
      - Chris S - Could do that now?
        - Eddie S - How much would it cost to get a different provider? Feel messed about by Sky.
          - Ryan LG - £8000 to rewire. Surely cheaper to make it safer and keep in JCR.
      - Dougie - Is it in office because of problems?
        - Leo G - Perhaps there isn't a signal point there.

### **This JCR further notes:**

- vii) That although (i) have at least one option at every meal in (ii), (iii) often only have the salad bar as an option and are unable to attend (ii) because it is unlikely that they will be catered to.
- viii) That going to (ii) is an important part of social life in (iv) and no one should be excluded from this.
- ix) That non-(iii) can also enjoy (iii) meals.
- x) That (iii) meals are much more environmentally friendly than meals containing meat, or even (i) meals.
- xi) That Debbie, the head chef, and Ruedi Baumann, the Director of Accommodation, Catering and Conferences, have both agreed to run the (vi) below, provided they have the support of the student community.
- xii) That (v) originally proposed this motion and it passed at the beginning of this term.

### **It therefore proposes:**

For the JCR to officially pledge its support for the (vi) to begin running in Hilary Term, which would involve:

- There being a (iii) option instead of a (i) option every Monday dinner
- There being an open invitation from Debbie to all students calling for vegan recipes
- There being an agreement to revisit this issue in Trinity term and potentially make it a permanent change, or amend it to better suit the needs of (v), JCR and Jesus College members or staff.

## **27. BALLOT PROBLEMS**

- (iii) That in future years the same problem may arise with numbers of three person or four person flats.

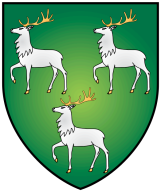
### **It therefore proposes:**

People who no longer have single rooms would have been put at bottom so it's fairer to have a re-ballot. Will talk to college to prevent this happening.
